The UUSS Endowment Trust was established in 1980 to safeguard and strengthen our congregation's mission and long-term vitality. The trust receives gifts from members and friends, invests such gifts in a prudent and diversified manner, and annually uses a percentage of the trust's value for special and non-recurring needs of UUSS.

Status of Loan to UUSS for building renovation and expansion

- \$325,000 loan to UUSS was made in 2015
- Interest (1%) paid quarterly (about \$700 per quarter)
- Due on June 30, 2025

## **Allocations since October 2019**

- \$3,800 for installation of blast film on windows in Welcome Hall and Main Hall
- \$2,900 for the Racial Justice/Eighth Principle Action Team (funds not dispersed because of COVID-19 restrictions on meeting in person)

## **Trustees**

There are five Endowment Trustees: Three are elected by the congregation, one is appointed by the UUSS Board of Trustees, and one minister. Currently serving are:
